READING:

- · Reading literature and informational text
- Reading literature (short and long adventure and mystery texts)
- Reading informational text (literary nonfiction: autobiographies, biographies, memoirs, historical accounts based on personal life events)
- Reading literature (e.g., fractured fairy tales, fairy tales, poetry)
- · Reading informational text sets

Writing:

- · Writing in response to reading, write routinely for extended time frames

- Writing a narrative (real or imagined)
- Writing in response to reading; writing informative/explanatory text
- · Writing an opinion, supporting a point of view with reasons and information
- · Writing an informative/explanatory piece
- · Writing an opinion/argument
- Using the research process to write an informative/explanatory text (research report)
- Writing literary review (focused on theme, structure and visual elements)
- · Writing in response to reading
- Writing a narrative using techniques of a graphic novel or photo essay

Speaking and Listening:

- Engaging in collaborative discussion
- · Engaging in text-based collaborative discussion
- · Presenting and listening to main points of informative/explanatory writing
- · Presenting an opinion using multimedia components
- · Engaging in collaborative discussions; summarizing text; reporting on a topic

• Engaging in collaborative discussions (text-based), summarize information visually, quantitatively, and orally

Language:

- · Using capitalization, punctuation (use of commas), and spelling
- · Using conventions, capitalization, punctuating titles, spelling
- Using figurative language and verb tense
- · Learning the meaning of unknown words in context, academic and domain-specific words and phrases
- · Using the function of conjunctions, correlative conjunctions, to clarify the meaning of unknown and multiple meaning words and vocabulary
- · Applying grade appropriate grammar and conventions

Foundational Skills:

Applying phonics, word analysis skills, accuracy, fluency, and comprehension
